Thematic Article

Patterns - Lecture Set

Martina Handler, responsible for project development at WUS Austria, answers some questions on the project "Patterns - Lecture Set" funded by the ERSTE Foundation. The recent project succeeds the first project of the same name, which ended in February 2009.

Q: What is the project "Patterns - Lecture Set" all about? What are its aims and goals?

MH: Patterns is a transnational program designed by the ERSTE Foundation that aims at researching and understanding the recent cultural history of 17 countries in South East and Central Europe. Within our new project "Patterns - Lecture Set" we focus on the visual arts and culture of the 1960s until today. There will be a call for scholars from departments or universities in the fields of cultural history, art history and architecture. The goal is to enable these organisations to expand or change their existing curricula with new content.

Q: Who will benefit from "Patterns - Lecture Set"? Who is the target group?

MH: First of all, the universities of the region are the beneficiaries. They will have the opportunity to introduce new course modules or to offer external guest lectures. Second, this also trickles down to the students since they are able to subscribe to new courses and modules. Beside that, the project strengthens the regional cooperation of different universities in the field of cultural topics. From this point of view, the project is a welcome addition to the whole cultural and scientific environment of the entire region of South East and Central Europe.

Q: What are the next foreseen activities in the frame of this project?

MH: The project is still in its planning phase, but I can already confirm that the first call for proposals will start at the beginning of 2010. Approximately 10-15 applications will be granted in the course of this first application phase. The actual implementation is foreseen to start in the winter semester 2010/11. The project will go on until summer 2011. Of course more information will be made available the time given. For now, I am very thankful that the ERSTE Foundation gave us the possibility to prolong this very important and interesting project. I am already looking forward to the hopefully numerous applications.
