# Thematic Article

New projects on the topics of migration and sustainable development

### PROMIG - First Erasmus+ project with Afghanistan

WUS Austria, together with 11 other consortium members (3 EU universities, 6 universities from South Caucasus and 2 universities from Afghanistan), has become partner in the Capacity Building project Promoting Migration Studies in Higher Education. We are happy that for the first time, institutions from Afghanistan are involved in an Erasmus+ cooperation.

The project is based on the national and regional priorities and development of cross regional cooperation practice amongst HEIs dealing with or interested in migration related research and curriculum development.

As a result of the successful accomplishment of previous Tempus project UNIMIG it was decided to bring together the experience from UNIMIG to build capacities in

Afghanistan for Kabul and Tabesh Universities, by curriculum development, deepening international relations capacity, improving the quality of education and teaching by adding migration related challenges faced by Afghanistan into the teaching schemes of partner country institutions and vice versa.

The project uses the experiences of the MA programs in migration studies within the South Caucasus region to enhance the development of a similar MA program in Afghanistan for ensuring that Afghan universities can offer curricula/education and research in the field of migration.

The MA program in migration studies will be established together with and through a Migration Competence Centre in Kabul, which will become a hub for cooperation between academic, research and public institutions.

To enhance sustainability and impact the project furthermore aims at developing LLL training modules for students, representatives of government and Civil Society Organisations in all partner countries. In order to attract young students/researcher the project also aims to establish an annual Cross-Regional Summer School.

## InterCap - WUS Austria participating in an EuropeAid project

In the current context of a raised feeling of insecurity in Europe it is much important to learn how the perceptions of (in)-security and risk influence understanding of migration, sustainable development, roles, responsibilities and lifestyles of EU citizens in an interdependent world. These topics became the centre of attention in societies in Europe with the so called "migrant crisis" in 2015. The project thus addresses thematic fields that are underrepresented in teacher education and, consequently in schools' due to their actuality.

InterCap seeks to explore and strengthen the link between quality development education and attitudes towards migration and development, building on evidence-based practices, taking forward good cases and programs and establish synergies.

It is expected that InterCap's results include building of the capacity of Civil Society Organisations and University teacher trainers in participatory methods, establishing a cross European development education community of practice, increasing the understanding of representatives from education authorities on Policy Coherence for Development, and empowering the collaboration among teacher trainers, pre-service teachers and students through participatory methods.

Awareness raising will contribute to critical thinking on global topics in education and consequently, more students will understand global interdependencies in an ever-complex world.
