Regarding our ongoing projects, we organized workshops on learning outcomes and curriculum development and design thinking for the HERAS project in Kosovo, continued working on guidelines for a National Qualification Framework and a qualification data base in Uzbekistan within the NURSLING project, supported the quality management for AtLETyC project and participated in efforts to set up a Migration Competence Center at an Afghan partner university (PROMIG project). Within the HERAS project (Kosovo) we are happy to announce two open Calls: The HERAS Scholarship Fund invites students, professionals and post-doc researchers from Kosovo who are staff members at Kosovan public universities to apply for a PhD/Post-doc fellowship for (Austrian) universities. The application deadline is 31.1.2018.

The second Call is for scientific networking and project cooperation between researchers from public universities and universities of applied sciences in Austria, in Kosovo and the Western Balkan region with special attention to young and early stage researchers. The year 2018, WUS Austria is starting actively with kick off meetings for two new projects: InterCap, a project that aims to enhance critical understanding of migration and sustainable development, in the context of SDGs and the project Sport Against Violence and Exclusion / SAVE that will aim at preventing and fighting against racism and violence among youth in sport clubs (in particular grass root sports, amateur and recreational sport). Besides that, beginning of the new year our staff will be busy writing applications for new projects.

"Is teaching always political? New challenges in higher education"

"Is teaching always political? New challenges in higher education" was the title of the final conference of the PATTERNS Lectures, a project initiated by ERSTE Foundation and implemented

by WUS Austria. The project runs in a series of rounds for the 4th time and supports the development of new university courses in Central and South East Europe in the fields of art history, cultural theory, and cultural studies. In the final event of the 4th round of PATTERNS, lecturers from different editions came together, discussing freedom of speech in the classroom, the role of university teachers and students as part of civil society, and universities' responsibility for engagement and democracy.

The conference took place on 24 - 25 November 2017, in cooperation with the Academy of Fine Arts Vienna, in the beautiful and inspiring setting of the Atelierhaus. The event hosted four panels including vivid discussions and left us with many more questions and some insights into daily practices from the PATTERNS Lectures community.

In the frame of the conference we asked and discussed questions such as: Is teaching always political? Has teaching always been political? What is the responsibility of the lecturer? How to deal with political discussions, with hate speech in the class room? Are there limits of freedom of speech in the classroom? Who should draw them, and where? How do lecturers critically interact with institutions like the university, the state, art and culture? How should students be involved in civil society engagement?

The conference brought inputs from different perspectives and a panel discussion about freedom of speech, civil society engagement and democracy with Boris Buden, Elke Krasny and Hedvig Turai (PATTERNS Lectures Advisors), moderated by Silke Lange.
