## **Fditorial**

Dear readers,

Spring has finally arrived and we look forward to a busy season until the summer. Since the start of the new year several deadlines have kept us occupied, the most prominent of which was the deadline for handing in project proposals to the European Commission (EC) within the framework of Tempus/4<sup>th</sup> Call in February this year (altogether, 531 applications were handed in to the EC!).

We also managed to publish the *WUS Austria Review 2009-2010* which provides an overview of our current activities and a selection of our projects, including reports from our local offices in Belgrade, Podgorica, Prishtina and Sarajevo, as well as many personal impressions and comments. Furthermore, we have only recently published a *Manual about Higher Education in South Eastern Europe - University-Economy Partnerships for Enhancing Knowledge Transfer*. Several new projects have started in the last couple of months, *such as* INTERFACE or Competence@University (CUP) of Prishtina:

The project INTERFACE will contribute to ensuring that the targeted Universities (PCU) are able to facilitate the graduates' entrance into the labor market through enhanced partnerships with enterprises; to set up an institutionalized Life Long Learning (LLL) system, and to establish a quality improvement system through coordinated contact with alumni.

Competence@University of Prishtina (CUP) is the follow-up of the Tempus project "Competence" that has been implemented in Bosnia-Herzegovina, Macedonia, Montenegro and Serbia since 2009. CUP addresses the missing link between Higher Education and economy in Kosovo and aims at developing and / or advancing procedures and tools for assessing and improving the match between competences developed by institutions of higher education and those required by the labor market in Kosovo.

In addition we have launched another new project which has already become very dear to us - the "First Children's University in Bosnia and Herzegovina", which is partly financed by the **Robert Bosch Stiftung** and **ERSTE Stiftung**. You will find more detailed information on this particular project in the article below.

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## Thematic Article

Children's University in Bosnia and Herzegovina

WUS Austria has launched a new project which aims at introducing the first Children's University in Bosnia and Herzegovina (BiH). Apart from WUS Austria the universities in Sarajevo, Banja Luka and Mostar and approximately nine schools from these cities are involved in the project Children's University.

The overall objectives of the action are to provide knowledge transfer for 8-12 year old children and to promote access to higher education for all children without boundaries. Through this project many children experience their first encounter with the university and learn more about their future educational choices. The Children's University aims to increase the interest in science, research and technology from a very young age and engage children in exciting, interactive, real-world learning experiences. This way the children develop knowledge, creativity and personal growth, and they are encouraged to be curious and to think critically. Moreover, this project contributes to facilitating the dialogue between various ethnic and social groups of society and co-operations among different regions in order to strengthen the role of civil society.

Currently WUS Austria is in the process of raising awareness among the ministries and schools in BiH and among the public in BiH and abroad. Moreover, the academic and social programme for the Children's University is going to be prepared. WUS Austria always puts a strong emphasis on the sustainability of its projects and will therefore take necessary measures regarding the monitoring and quality control. Within the framework of this project a close co-operation with the European Children's University Network - EUCU.NET will also be established. This network fosters the dialogue between organizers of Children's Universities and supports new projects.

We look forward to implementing this project and will keep you informed on the further development!
